³⁵ With the coming of evening that same day, Jesus said to the disciples, "Let's cross over to the other shore." ³⁶ Leaving the crowd behind, they took Jesus in the boat in which he was sitting. There were other boats with them.

³⁷ Then a fierce gale arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat so much that it was almost swamped. ³⁸ But Jesus was in the stern threw it all, sound asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said, "Teacher, doesn't it matter to you that we are going to drown?" ³⁹ Jesus awoke, rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Quiet!" And the wind dropped and everything was perfectly calm. ⁴⁰ Jesus then said to the disciples, "Why were you so frightened? Have you no faith?"
