The Prayer of Jesus, (from The New Zealand Anglican Prayer Book)

Eternal Spirit, Earthmaker, Painbearer, Lifegiver, Source of all that is and that shall be, Father, Mother, Guardian of us all, Loving God, in whom is heaven: The hallowing of your name echoes through the universe! First Reading: *Ephesians 4:1-16*

I plead with you, then, in the name of our Redeemer, to lead a life worthy of your calling. Treat one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness, and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit through the peace that binds you together.

There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called into one hope when you were called. There is one Savior, one faith, one baptism, one God and Creator of all, who is over all, who works through all and is within all.

Each of us has received God's grace in the measure in which Christ has bestowed it. This you find the scripture saying: "You ascended on high, leading captives in your train, and giving gifts to people."

"You ascended – what does this mean but that Christ first descended into the lower regions of the earth? The One who descended is the very One who ascended high above the heavens in order to fill the whole universe.

And to some, the gift that they were given is that they should be apostles; to some, prophets; to some, evangelists; to some, teachers, to some, pastors. These gifts were given to fully equip the holy ones for the work of service, and to build up the body of Christ, until we all attain unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Only Begotten of God, until we become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

Let us then be children no longer, tossed here and there, carried about by every wind of doctrine, or by human trickery or crafty, deceitful schemes. Rather, let us speak the truth in love, and grow to full maturity in Christ, the head.

Through Christ, the whole body grows. With the proper functioning of each member, firmly joined together by each supporting ligament, the body builds itself up in love.

Gospel: *John 6:24-35*

The next day, the crowd that had stayed on the other side of the lake saw that only one boat had been there; and they knew that Jesus had not gotten into the boat with the disciples – the disciples had set off by themselves. Other boats, however, had put in from Tiberius, near the place where the bread had been eaten after the Rabbi had given thanks. When the people saw that neither Jesus nor the disciples were there, they got into those boats and crossed to Capernaum looking for Jesus.

When they found Jesus on the other side of the lake, they said, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus answered them, "The truth of the matter is, you're not looking for me because you've seen signs, but because you've eaten your fill of the bread. You shouldn't be working for perishable food, but for the life-giving food that lasts for all eternity. This the Chosen One can give you, for the Chosen One bears the seal of Abba-God."

At this they said, "What must we do to perform the works of God?"

Jesus replied, "This is the work of God: to believe in the one whom God has sent."

So they asked Jesus, "What sign are you going to give to show us that we should believe in you? What will you do? Our ancestors had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says, 'God gave them bread from heaven to eat."

Jesus said to them, "The truth of the matter is, Moses hasn't given you bread from heaven; yet my Abba gives you the true bread from heaven, for the bread of God is the one who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.

"Teacher," they said, "give us this bread from now on."

Jesus explained to them, "I am the bread of life. No one who comes to me will ever be hungry, and no one who believes in me will ever be thirsty."

Holy Communion The Invitation

God calls us to forgive, to build peace, and to share loving fellowship.

Everyone may come to the table of reconciliation – which means all persons – all ages, cultures, sexual identities, abilities, religions, and diversities – those who affirm their elemental worth, and those who are yet to do so.

Let us hear these words of Holy Communion, and then we will share the bread and juice.

The Purpose

Long ago, God sought to commune with us, and by choosing to live with us embodied as Jesus, God experienced all the desires and temptations that we face in our daily living as human beings.

Jesus, then, first showed us how to restrain those human desires and temptations; and in calling his disciples and followers, he revealed how to spread his way of love and peace in our wide and wonderful community here on Earth.

<u>Presenting the Elements</u>

To remind us of the union of body and spirit, Jesus took a loaf of bread, gave thanks, broke it like we often break in our relationships with one another, and showed us the way to reconcile by asking us to share our bread with each other.

By sharing the broken bread, we participate in and become the body of Christ in the world.

In the same way, Jesus took the cup filled with the fruit of the vine, again gave thanks, and asked us to drink of the same spirit of loving-kindness and harmony that filled him.

By sharing the cup of blessing, we participate in and become the new life of Christ in the world.

What we symbolize here in this holy space, we justify by our service when we go forth from this place.
