The Prayer of Jesus, (from The New Zealand Anglican Prayer Book)

First Reading: Ephesians 5:15-20 Inclusive Bible

Keep careful watch over your conduct. Don't act like fools, but rather like wise and thoughtful people. Make the most of your time, for these are evil days. Don't continue ignorance, but try to discern the will of God.

Avoid getting drunk on wine - that is debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit, meditating on psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making music to God in your hearts.

Always give thanks to Abba God for everything, in the name of Jesus, our Messiah.

Spirit of God, descend upon my heart; wean it from earth, through all its pulses move; Stoop to my weakness, mighty as you are, and make me love you as I ought to love.

I ask no dream, no prophet ecstasies, no sudden rending of the veil of clay, No angel visitant, no opening skies; but take the dimness of my soul away.

Have you not bid us love every way? All, all your own: soul, heart, and strength, and mind; I see your cross – there teach my heart to stay: O let me seek you, and O let me find.

Teach me to feel that you are always nigh; teach me the struggles of the soul to bear; To check the rising doubt, the rebel sigh; teach me the patience of unanswered prayer.

Teach me to love you as your angels love, one holy passion filling all my frame; The baptism of the heaven descended above, my heart and altar, and your love the flame.

Gospel: John 6:35-45a

Jesus explained to them, "I am the bread of life. No one who comes to me will ever be hungry; no one who believes in me will be thirsty. But as I told you, you see me and still don't believe. Everyone Abba God gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I won't turn away. For I have come from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of the One who sent me.

It is the will of the One who sent me that I lose none of those given to me, but rather raise them up on the last day. Indeed, this is the will of my Abba: that everyone who sees and believes in the Only Begotten will have eternal life. These are the ones I will raise up on the last day."

The Temple authorities started to grumble in protest because Jesus claimed, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." They kept saying, "Isn't this Jesus, son of Mary and Joseph? Don't we know his mother and father? How can he claim to have come down from heaven?"

"Stop your grumbling," Jesus told them. "No one can come to me unless drawn by Abba God, who sent me - and those I will raise up on the last day. It is written in the prophets: 'They will all be taught by God.""
