Gospel Reading from the Book of Luke, 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, Philip his brother tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene.

In those days, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the Word of God came to John, ben-Zechariah, in the desert. John went through the entire region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as is written in the words of Isaiah, the prophet:

"A herald's voice in the desert, crying 'Make ready the way of our God; clear a straight path. Every valley will be filled, and every mountain and hill will be leveled. The twisted paths will be made straight, and the rough places smooth – and all humankind will see the salvation of God.' The mouth of God has spoken it."
